What will I be learning this year?

Literacy: You will complete four PATs this year. These will focus on reading comprehension, grammar, listening, and spelling. To personalise your learning, we need to assess your literacy skills at the beginning of Term 1 and check your progress during the year. To help strengthen your reading comprehension, fluency, and vocabulary we will be using a class workbook to support your literacy progress.

Reading: To encourage your reading, you will need a real paper book in class for the regular Year 10 Class Book Club Programme. As part of this, you will visit the Gibson Centre library fortnightly. You will be expected to read as part of your Home Learning. We would like you to read a wide range of genres.

Literacy corequisite standards: corequisite literacy standards will directly assess foundational literacy and will be a mandatory part of your NCEA qualification. To achieve the NCEA corequisite standards, you will need to gain 10 literacy credits- five for reading and five for writing. The standards will ensure that everyone who has gained an NCEA qualification has a good level of foundational literacy. These assessments will happen around Term 3.
